

SCORM

In brief

Short for "Shareable Content Object Reference Model", in e-learning SCORM represents the standard of the re-use, tracking and cataloguing of didactic objects.

What is it?

SCORM is a reference standard for communication between e-learning objects and the e-learning platforms that provide courses/content. This protocol defines, in a generic manner, the paradigms and the variables involved in an electronic training object. It imposes the syntax and standard packaging of the content and internal cataloguing of the same so that the content is usable, traceable, indexed and usable or reusable on any platform that is SCORM compatible.

What is it for?

- allowing tracking and detailed reports on the host platform
- allowing, specifically, tracking of evaluations and ratings of time of use or of sessions for a given content, of the number of attempts, of the percentage of progress within a course or of a user's answers in a given quiz and whether the quiz has been passed or not
